





- 17/43,44: Glory to Him! He is high above all that they say! Exalted and Great (beyond measure)! The seven heavens and the earth, and all beings therein, declare His glory: there is not a thing but celebrates His praise, and yet ye understand not how they declare His glory! Verily He's Oft-Forbearing, Most Forgiving!
- 2/12: The life of this world is alluring to those who reject faith, and they scoff at those who believe. But the righteous will be above them on the Day of Resurrection, for Allah bestows His abundance without measure on whom He will.
- 27/73-75: But verily thy Lord is full of grace to mankind: yet most of them are ungrateful. And verily thy Lord knoweth all that their hearts do hide, as well as all that they reveal. Nor is there aught of the Unseen, in heaven or earth, but is (recorded) in a clear record.
