Welcome to a time of contemplative prayer and meditation, prayer in the spirit of Taizé.

Tonight, the visual focal point for our prayer is the cross. Prayer around the cross is a way of expressing an invisible communion not only with the crucified Jesus but with all who suffer—all the victims of abandonment, abuse, discrimination or torture, all those condemned to silence.

Gathered before the cross in the presence of Christ, we sing simple, repetitive songs, listen to the Word of God, pray for peace and reconciliation and engage in silent reflection. This meditative prayer practice allows the mystery of God to become tangible through the beauty of simplicity.

Prayer in the Taizé spirit often involves songs in more than one language, uniting us with Christians around the world.

Esta noche, el punto focal para nuestros ojos es la cruz. La oración en torno a la cruz nos permite participar en una comunión invisible no sólo con el Crucificado, sino también con los que sufren, los que están abandonados, perseguidos o torturados, condenados al silencio.

Reunidos ante la cruz en la presencia de Cristo, cantemos cantos sencillos y repetitivos, escuchamos a la Palabra de Dios, oramos por la paz y reconciliación y participamos en reflejo silencioso. Este estilo de oración permite el misterio de Dios a sentirse aquí a través de la belleza de la simplicidad.

La oración de Taizé usa cantos en más de un idioma, nos une con cristianos alrededor del mundo.

Silent Prayer

(5-8 minutes)

When we try to express communion with God in words, we rapidly reach the end of our capacities. But in the depths of our being, through the Holy Spirit, Christ is praying, far more than we imagine. Compared to the immensity of that hidden prayer of Christ in us, our explicit prayer dwindle to almost nothing. That is why silence is so essential in discovering the heart of prayer.

For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen!


Padrenuestro

Prayer Before the Cross

The Cross of Christ is inseparable from his Resurrection. They are two aspects of one and the same event. It is the cross that reminds us that we must die to ourselves and rise in Christ.

During the following songs, those who wish to do so are invited to come up to the cross to pray. You may make a gesture, such as touching the cross or placing your forehead on the wood of the cross, a sign that you are silently entrusting to Christ all that burdens you as well as the difficulties of other people, both those you know personally and those far away: the oppressed, the ill, the poor, the persecuted.

This prayer reminds us that here and now, risen from the dead, Christ accompanies every human being in their suffering, even when his presence is not recognized.

Durante el canto a continuación, aquellos que deseen hacerlo pueden venir a la cruz a orar. Usted puede hacer un gesto, como tocar la cruz o colocar la frente sobre la madera de la cruz, un gesto puede expresare nuestra oración: nos acercamos uno tras otro a la cruz para poner algunos instantes nuestra frente sobre la madera de la cruz, confiando silenciosamente a Cristo, sin palabras, nuestras propias cargas y también todo lo que pesa sobre los demás, cerca de nosotros o lejos, los oprimidos, los necesitados, los enfermos, los perseguidos.

Tenemos esta confianza de que, conocido o no, el Resucitado acompaña a cada ser humano en su sufrimiento.
